

### Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

We are learning about responsibility. Please could you talk to your child about what this means? Do they have any prior knowledge of what responsibility means?

You could:

- Take responsibility of setting the table for dinner.
- Take responsibility of tidying away your toys.
- Take responsibility of making your bed.

### Literacy Challenges (Mark Making):

1) Go on a letter hunt around your house. Can you find the different letters from your name? Look in books, on food packaging and even on your clothes.

2) Focus on one type of mark making 'wavy line'- This week focus on creating a wavy line. How could you do this? Could you use crayons/pencils to create different wavy lines, you can try drawing small, medium and big wavy lines?

### Phonics Challenges:

1) Look at your favourite books. Can you find any words that rhyme? For example cat and hat or dog and frog. How many different rhyming words did you find?

2) Can you now think of your own rhyming sentence using some of the rhyming words you found? For example, the red fox sat on the shiny box.

### Physical Development- Gross Motor (PE)

1) Practice different ways of moving. Can you practice slithering, shuffling, rolling, crawling, walking, running, jumping, skipping, sliding and hopping?

2) Can you make up your own pattern of movements for someone else in your house to copy?

### Mathematical Challenges:

1) Play a board game like snakes and ladders with someone in your house. Can you count the number of spots on the dice? Do you notice the spots are in a pattern?

Try this 'Shape' challenge:

1) Have a go at designing a shape monster. Can you include at least 3 different shapes in your design. Maybe your monster will have a triangle head, circle hands and a rectangle body.
