

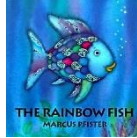
Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

O o O o

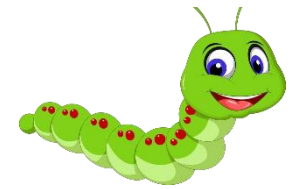
